

Articulation Agreement

Bushnell University and
2025-2026 – 2030-2031

This letter of agreement has been enacted to facilitate the transfer of students from Columbia Gorge Community College (CGCC) with the agreed transfer work to Bushnell University (Bushnell). The agreement is to be enacted for Bushnell's 2025-2026 academic year and to remain in effect for five years (through the 2030-2031 academic year). Annual reviews of the curriculum for both institutions may necessitate mutually agreed upon updates to the transfer agreement. These updates will be documented and reaffirmed each summer until such time as (a) the agreement is mutually abandoned, (b) the 5-year timeframe elapses, or (c) a new agreement is formally approved by CGCC and Bushnell either replacing or extending the agreement.

Bushnell University anticipates working with Columbia Gorge Community College to refine existing articulations, as well as explore additional articulation pathways.

Degree Requirements

A total of 124 semester (186 quarter) credits are required for a Bachelor's degree from Bushnell, with a minimum of 27 semester (40.5 quarter) credits in the upper division (300-400 level), and a minimum of 30 credits taken in residency.
